"Back To School!" It's a slogan we have all come to love, as we organize our lives and get back into the routine of life. But this year back to school looks and feels different for us all. Whether your kids are home on zoom or in person with masks, the world looks vastly different than it did last fall! The Nourish Every Child team has had to adapt and change with the evolving world around us.



In Haiti, our sponsored kids have returned to school! There are washing hands and wearing masks but social distancing is virtually impossible in the cramped quarters of most schools. The kids are so happy to be back in the classroom and to be receiving a meal a day through the nutrition program. Many of the kids in our program have suffered tremendous food shortages since the closure of schools due to Covid-19, as the meal served at school is their only meal each day.

unrest has led to severe food shortages. The Haitian people are hesitant to follow social distancing and stay at home orders, as their daily work is the only way to obtain food for the day. The only testing site in the country was in Port-au-Prince and the lab is currently broken. With minimal access to oxygen therapy and only 64 working ventilators in the country of 11 million, many Haitian people are dying at home of "the fever".

The situation on the ground in Haiti is tenuous at best. The combination of Covid and political

Nourish Every Child has evolved with the pandemic to meet the needs of the vulnerable children we serve. We have provided every family in our program with four washable masks and a home water filtration system. The clay water filter will last up to ten years and will prevent many of the water borne illnesses endemic in Haiti.

The postponement of our Annual Gala to Spring 2021, has led us to return to grassroots fundraising efforts to keep our commitment to our 180 scholars for the 2020-2021 school year. On my first trip to Haiti, I saw first-hand the impact of my gift and the gifts of other donors to children sponsored by Nourish Every Child. The singing from the classroom, the smell of food from the school's kitchen and the smiles on the children's faces were beyond rewarding. In those moments, I saw the importance and criticality of NEC. NEC gives some of the most vulnerable children a fighting chance not only breaks what is ostensibly a never-ending cycle of poverty, but to thrive.
